Wednesday, June 1 - Friday, August 19

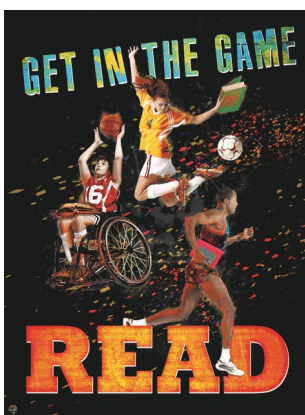

We will use only your first name when we share your story. We will use your image only if you send us a photo of yourself. If you prefer to remain anonymous, just let us know, and we will not share your name or image with the public.

Enjoy lullabies, nursery rhymes, finger plays, bounces, and sign language. Best with one child per adult. For children age 24 months and under. No registration required.

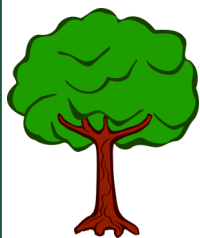
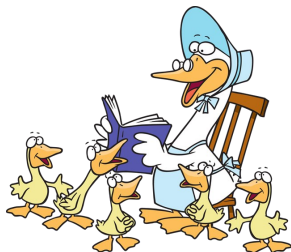


MOTHER GOOSE

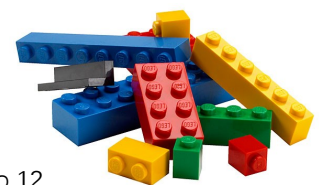

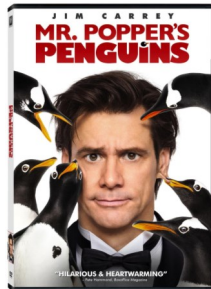

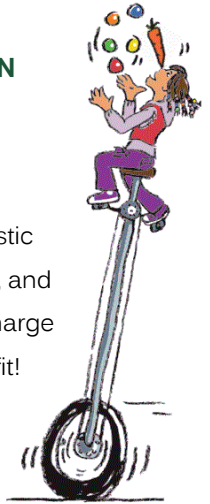


TOBE FIT: THE JUGGLING NUTRITION MAGICIAN SHOW

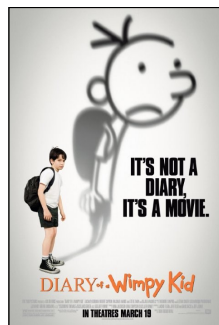

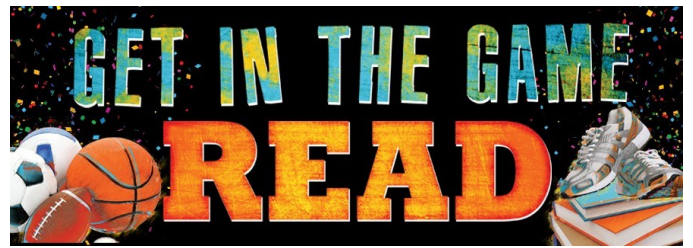
