### Ancient Burying Grounds of the Town of Waterbury, Connecticut

- Prichard, Katharine A. GE 974.69435 (1917)

Anyone curious about Waterbury's colonial past will find this volume interesting. If you walk along Meadow Street and look up at the wall that encloses Library Park, you can see some of the headstones that were once in the Grand Street Cemetery, the oldest burial place in the city. The only way to appreciate the headstones that did not survive, is to look them up in this volume. (The index at the back of the book is of some assistance; however, it has not been found to be 100 percent reliable.) Information about many small early cemeteries located in the outlying areas, which have since become separate towns, is also included.

### Book of the Riverside Cemetery

GE 974.69435 (1889)

This book provides complete background information about how this cemetery, which opened in 1853, came to be organized as well as details about the design and landscape. (lavishly illustrated)

From January 18, 1889 through February 11, 1889, the daily newspaper published a list compiled by Sturgis M. Judd of the dead in all of Waterbury's cemeteries, except Riverside and St. Joseph's.
