CENSUS 2020 QUICK FACTS

- The 2020 Census counts every person living in each household on April 1, 2020.
- The U.S. Census is taken every 10 years. The first one was taken in 1790.
- The Census can be filled out online, by mail, or by phone starting in March.
- Your personal information is kept private by law for 72 years.
- Everyone needs to be counted, even babies.
- The number of people who are reported on the Census becomes the official number of people who live in a town or state for the next 10 years.
- Federal funding for schools, roads, and other projects is based on the number of people who live in a town or state.
- The number of representatives each state gets in the U.S. Congress is based on the number of people who live in the state. District boundaries are also based on the number of people reported on the Census.

FREE TAX PREPARATION





Call 211 to schedule an appointment at the library or at any other service location.

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) will be available at the library for low-to-moderate-income individuals and families earning less than \$56,000 a year.

IRS-trained volunteers are certified to prepare simple tax returns and screen customers for special tax credits and savings plans. Visiting a VITA site instead of a paid tax preparer saves each filer an average of \$200.

Taxes can be filed electronically, in which case refunds are received within 7-10 days.

VITA is made possible through a partnership with United Way, the Connecticut Association for Human Services, and the Internal Revenue Service.




