CELEBRATING WATERBURY'S 350TH ANNIVERSARY

The City of Waterbury is celebrating 350 years since its founding as a colonial village in 1674. The library will have special history collections on view starting in September and a variety of programs celebrating Waterbury's history. You can spot those programs in this newsletter by looking for the Waterbury logo seen here.



Other celebrations citywide include the 350th Anniversary Community Festival on the Green on Friday, September 27, 4 p.m. - 8:30 p.m. and The Gathering in Library Park on Saturday, September 28, 11 a.m. - 7 p.m. The Mattatuck Museum is a great resource for Waterbury history exhibits and programs. SEPTEMBER IS LIBRARY CARD SIGNUP MONTH

Start the school year right—make sure everyone in the family has their own library card! To get a card for a child, a parent or other legal guardian must bring to the library a photo ID and proof of Waterbury residency.

Library cards are free for all ages. If you need a replacement card, a small fee will apply. You can also download the free Acorn Catalog app to your phone. After you log into Acorn with your library card number and password, you will always have it available on your phone to use at the library.

Readers Garden Book Store


The Friends of the Library book store is located on the first floor of the library. Purchases can be made using cash, credit card, or check at the library's front desk.
