Our November exhibits will feature work by Black, Latine, and Afro Latine artists, curated by the Afro Caribbean Cultural Center.



#### SEPTEMBER IS LIBRARY CARD SIGNUP MONTH

Library cards are free for all ages. If you need a replacement card, a small fee will apply. You can also download the free Acorn Catalog app to your phone. After you log into Acorn with your library card number and password, you will always have it available on your phone to use at the library.
